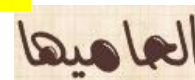

Ralph Waldo Emerson (1803–1882) was an influential American writer, poet, and lecturer.

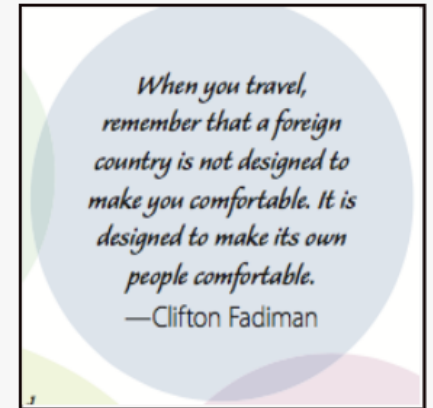
Clifton Fadiman (1904–1999) was an American author, editor, and popular radio and television personality.
