1	pickpocket (n.)	a thief who steals things out of pockets or bags, especially in a crowd	He kept his wallet in his hand because he knew there would be pickpockets in the crowd.	
2	victim (n.)	someone or something which has been hurt, damaged, or killed or has suffered, either because of the actions of someone or something else, or because of illness or chance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children are the innocent and helpless victims of the fighting. victims of crime. 	
3	pretend (v.) pretended / pretended	to behave as if something is true when you know that it is not	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children pretended they were cowboys. She is not really hurt – she is only pretending.
