



	Be + S + going to + v ?		
What	Am - Is - Are What are you going to do on your vacation ?	I'm going to travel to Africa.	
When	When is he going to leave?	He's going to leave next week.	
Which	Which countries is he going to visit ?	He's going to visit Tunisia & Morocco.	
How	How are we going to go ?	We're going to go by plane.	
Where	Where am I going to travel with them ?	You're going to stay in a four - star hotel.	
Who	Who is going to travel with them?	They're going to travel with friends.	
How long	How long are they going to stay /	They're going to stay for a month	



Present Progressive

Present Progressive					
Usage	For actions happening now or	for definite arrangements in the future.			
	Now	future			
Form	S + be + v ing am - is - are	S + be + v ing am - is - are			
Examples	My friends <u>are waiting</u> for me at the airport.	My friends are arriving tomorrow.			
Questions	What are you doing now ?	What are you doing tonight?			



Will Versus Be going to				
	Will	Be + going to		
Usage	for uncertain or indefinite plans . use will with maybe or probably.	To talk about plans		
Example of questions ?	Where <u>will</u> you stay ?	What <u>are you going to</u> do on your vacation?		
Answers	Maybe <u>I'll stay</u> with friends.	I' <u>m going to travel</u> to Europe.		
	I probably <u>won't stay</u> in a hotel.	I <u>'m</u> not going to travel this year.		

Time Expressions for the future

Time Expressions for the future	tomorrow night - this year - soon - in an hour - next month		
	1	I'm leaving <mark>tomorrow night</mark> .	
	2	This year we will go on vacation to Jordan.	
Examples	3	They are flying to Oman <mark>on Thursday</mark> .	
	4	Hurry! They will be here <mark>soon</mark> !	
	5	I am meeting her <mark>in an hour</mark> .	
	6	we will sit examinations next month.
