Affirmative sentences, Negative tags auxiliary verb (not) + Subject?

There's a cash machine on Main Street, isn't there? There's a new manager in charge, isn't there? It was a part-time job, wasn't it? It was the night shift you wanted, wasn't it? You are working today, aren't you? You want the total amount in 50 euro notes, don't you? You charge commission, don't you? He works in a bank, doesn't he? They invested in the property market, didn't they? They took over the company, didn't they? You will go to the bank, won't you? You will apply for this job, won't you?

Negative sentences, Affirmative tags auxiliary verb + Subject?

They are not going to go look for another job, are they? You are not going to resign from your job, are you? He didn't get the job, did he? You won't work this Saturday, will you? We won't have another meeting today, will we?
