Real Talk

a bit = a little

run down = in need of fixing/not looked after

Definitely! = an expression that shows strong agreement

The only thing is that... = used to introduce a problem/issue

you can't have it all = everything has something negative

Who says a bit? (Adel)

Adel's apartment was a bit what? (run down)

Was it very run down or a little run down? (a little)

Use **a bit** to talk about how you're feeling at the moment.

For example: *I'm a bit sleepy/bored/hungry, etc.*

☺ **What does Adel say was run down?** (his new apartment)

Why isn't it run down now? (He renovated it.)

*When you renovate a building, you paint and repair things so that it is in good condition.

Are there any buildings in our town that are run down?

Who says Definitely? (Adel)

Why does he say it? (He is very certain about his answer to the question.) For example: **Will you be happy if you have no homework tonight? Definitely**

☺ **Who says The only thing is that...?** (Adel)

What does he say next? (He spends a lot of time commuting.)

Is this a good thing or bad thing? (bad)

Remind students that in informal situations, *you* is pronounced /yə/ rather than /yu/ in sentences such as the examples they just heard.




Teaching Tip

Additional Activity
