At this moment there are about 1800 thunderstorms happening somewhere on Earth. Although the chance of being struck by lightning is about 1 in 700,000, lightning is a very dangerous weather condition. Every year in the United States, about 73 people are struck and killed by lightning, and about 300 more people are injured by lightning. Following a few simple safety rules can help to keep you safe from injury or death during a storm.

1. As soon as you can hear thunder during a storm, you are within 10 miles of lightning and in danger of being struck. Find shelter immediately. Try to go inside a building. Avoid open fields.
2. Do not stand under tall objects like trees or towers. The tallest object in an area is the most likely to be hit by lightning.
3. Avoid taking a shower or bath during a lightning storm. Stay away from electrical appliances, and don't use phones or computers.
4. Wait 30 minutes before going back outside after a storm.
