

•	Engage:			
]		Begin the lesson by displaying a few objects or pictures of objects (e.g., a small round table, a wooden dining chair, a beautiful red rose).		
		Ask the students to observe the objects carefully and brainstorm as many adjectives as they can to describe each object.		
]		• Facilitate a class discussion about the adjectives used and lead students to discover that there is a specific order in which adjectives are generally used before a noun.

	• •	• Discuss any exceptions to the rule, such as fixed phrases or idiomatic expressions, where the adjective order may differ.

]	• Divide the class into small groups and provide each group with a set of object cards (preferably pictures) and adjective cards.			
†	 Instruct the groups to work collaboratively to create sentences using the object and adjective cards while maintaining the correct order of adjectives.

- Provide feedback and clarification as needed.
