We all enjoy a good chew now and then, but did you know that chewing gum was first made by the Indians? The chewing gum that was bought and sold in America in the nineteenth century was originally made by the Indian tribe. **They** chewed a substance called chicle, taken from a big tree, as a way to stop thirst or fight hunger. It is extracted from the tree, where Farmers make a cut in the trunk of the tree and the liquid that comes out is collected and then dried. Then the gum goes through another process by adding different flavors to make the gum taste better. At that time, only kids and single women were allowed to chew it in public. Married women and widows could chew it privately to freshen their breath, while men could chew it in secret to clean their teeth. Chewing gum was then brought to Europe at the beginning of the twentieth. Due to the huge demand, chewing gum was produced in factories, using the same method as the Indian tribe did. These days, chewing gum is flavored in countless flavors, most common are mint or strawberry. It is sold and enjoyed everywhere, and it is bought by both young and old alike. But be careful it is rude to chew gum with your mouth open.
