


present Perfectjust → a short time ago.

the end of -

use negative sentence

I have n't finished my h.w yet.

question

Have you finished your h.w yet?

Already → S-th happened before we expected it to.= between have-has  
and Past Perfect

= at the end of the clause.

Ali has already repaired his car. vs

\* Have you already washed the dishes?

verb + Gerund



V + ing

He can't stand waiting in line.

I enjoy Cooking.

### Two-word verbs

verb + a particle

preposition

adverb

a pronoun object

must come between the verb and the particle.

*(it is circled in pink and labeled 'object')*

The chef cut up it into small pieces

put away the toys

put them away  
put the toys away

Turn off the light

Turn the light off

→ Turn it off.
