- 1-A direct object is a noun or pronoun that receives the action of a verb.
- 2-A direct object answers the question what or who.

$$S + V + D.O. + to/for + I.O.$$

My parents bought a new TV for me.

S + V + I.O. + D.O.

My parents bought \underline{me} \underline{a} \underline{new} \underline{TV} .
