1. With Certain Verbs:

ask - asks	asked
demand - demands	demanded
insist - insists	insisted
recommend - recommends	recommended

The subjunctive follows the sentence pattern:

Positive: S + verb + that + subject + base verb

Negative: S + verb + that + subject + (not) base verb



The verb [ask]

I ask that visitors stay away from young animals to protect them from diseases.

She asked that we not be late.

The verb [demand]

The examiner demanded that all the test booklets be collected.

The boss demanded that he not be late again.

The verb [insist]

I insist that you brush your teeth before you go to bed.

I insist that you go home early if you're not feeling well.

The manager insisted that he work late.

They insisted that we join them and their guests for dinner tomorrow evening.

The verb [recommend]

I recommend that you bring your résumé.

I recommend that you talk about your skills.

I recommend that you ask them questions.

I recommend that you talk about your skills.

I recommend that they like talking to people.

I recommend that you lock your doors.

I recommend that you take a nap.

I recommend that you stay out of the street.

I recommend that you cut your hair short.

I recommend that you walk for at least two hours a day.

I recommend that you put your educational background on it.

He recommended that he bring his résumé to the interview.

The verb [request]

The nurse requests that the waiting room be kept quiet.

He requested that we be at the board meeting tomorrow to express our views.

The verb [suggest]

I suggest that you send this first-class mail.

I suggest that you use a confident voice.

I suggest that you write a thank-you note afterwards.

I suggest that you give your email address.

I suggest that you try this on.

My job counselor suggested that I look for a job in sales.

The subjunctive is used with certain expressions It is essential

It is imperative

It is important

It is necessary



The subjunctive with expressions follows the sentence pattern:

Positive: Expression + that + subject + base verb

Negative: Expression + that + subject + (not) base verb



The expression [It is essential]

It is essential that the people of our country vote for me.

It is essential that you dress appropriately.

It is essential that you shake the interviewer's hand.

It is essential that you answer all of the questions.

It is essential that you list your work experience.

It is essential that they like to cook.

It is essential that they be good with children.

It is essential that you not quit your job before you find a new one.

It is essential that you brush well twice a day.

It is essential that we not be late for the meeting.

It is essential that you not get up during take-off and landing.

It is essential that we not exceed the word limit or our papers will not be accepted.

It is essential that my patients be comfortable and still while I work.

The expression [It is imperative]

It is imperative that the doctor wash his hands before entering the operating room.

It is imperative that you make eye contact.

It is imperative that you be clear and concise.

It is imperative that kids not play with matches.

It is imperative that the documents be submitted on time.

The expression [It is important]

It is important that you be at the meeting.

It is important that you dress nicely.

It is important that you sit up straight.

It is important that you include a list of references at the end.

It is important that they know how to sew.

It is important that they be good at math.

It is important that they like working out side.

It is important that you write your name at the top.

It is important that you not eat sweets.

It is important that race car drivers take the necessary safety precautions.

It is important that we catch this train.

It is important that you brush your teeth every day.

It is important that your cat take this medicine every day.

It is important that you not use a phone while we're in the air.

It is important that you wear a seat belt.

It is important that everybody wear a seatbelt.

It is important that I watch my screen and instruments at all times to help pilots

The expression [It is necessary]

It is necessary that you give your phone number.

It is necessary that they go to medical school.

It is necessary that they be healthy and strong.

It is necessary that you wear a seatbelt.

It is necessary that I wear a helmet and protective clothing when I am at work.

I'd like you + infinitive

I'd like you to help with this project.

I'd like you to consider applying for the job.

I'd like you to take two pills every morning.

I'd like you to open your mouth.

I'd like you to stay still.

I'd like you to clean your room after school today.

My boss would like me to finish this project today

I want you + infinitive

I want you to finish the report this afternoon

I want you to tell me about any problems you have.

I want you to call me if you have any questions.

I want you to clean your teeth.

I want you to do your homework.

I want you to stop smoking.

I want you to study the new proposals very carefully.

I want you to pick me up at 5 o'clock sharp.
