This always reminds me of the wise saying "A little knowledge is a dangerous thing." The dangers of little knowledge are so many and they happen every day. Take for example the case of the man who, having read in a newspaper or a magazine about the symptoms of a certain disease and the method of treating it, he applied these to himself and followed the method of treatment with serious results to his health because he had not seen a doctor.

We often read about harmful accidents resulting from little knowledge. Many people have been injured because of a careless person who thought he knew everything about guns. Polite Ways to Make Requests with Can, Could and Would

Q: **Can you** give me your credit card details, please? A: Certainly.

Q: **Could you** help me? A: Of course.

Q: **Would you** open the window, please? A: Sure.

Express Obligation: Must, Mustn't, Have to

You must stop at the 'STOP' sign. -You have to slow down at this junction.

You mustn't (must not) arrive late to work. -You have to be at the office at 9 a.m.

Express Necessity and Lack of Necessity

: Have to, Need to, Needn't, Don't have to, Don't Need to
