Comparative and Superlative Forms of Adjectives

The Comparative

Use adjective + -er or more + adjective to make the comparative.

The hotel is tall.

The hotel is taller than the office buildings.

The subway is **convenient**.

The subway is **more convenient** than the bus.

Note: The comparative is often used with than.

Why do we add -er to tall but add more before convenient? We add -er to most one syllable adjectives when we make them comparative, and use more with most three-syllable adjectives.

Use the + adjective + -est or the most + adjective to make the superlative.

The hotel is the tallest building in the city. The subway is **the fastest** transport in the city. It is also the most modern. It is also the most convenient.

Formation

Use -er or -est for one-syllable adjectives and adjectives that end in y; for example, busy-busier-busiest. Use *more* or *most* for longer adjectives.

Spelling Rules:

Most adjectives: old-older-oldest

Adjectives ending in e: nice-nicer-nicest

Adjectives ending in y: easy-easier-easiest

Adjectives ending in one vowel followed by one consonant: big-bigger-biggest, hot-hotter-hottest.

Some adjectives have irregular comparative and superlative forms.
