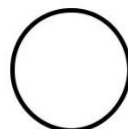

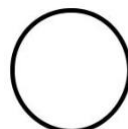

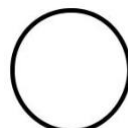

The Eiffel Tower

The *Eiffel Tower* is one of the most famous building in the world. It is a 324m high structure in the center of Paris, France. Over the years, it has become a symbol of the city and the country. When they built it, *The Eiffel Tower* was the tallest building in the world. The tower got its name from its designer, Gustave Eiffel, and it build, from 1887 to 1889. The tower opened to the public on 6 May 1889. Today, it is without doubt one of the most recognizable memorial in Europe, one that can be compared to the Statue of Liberty in New York, and the Big Ben is London.

Arabic coffee or (Gahwa) is a very important drink in Saudi Arabia and in the Arabian Gulf countries. Preparation, serving and drinking Arabic Coffee are derived from Bedouin hospitality. Usually, guests are served with Arabic Coffee and Dates.

It is all about tradition, hospitality and ceremony. It's a sign of welcome and marks the beginning and the end of a guest's visit.

It can be served anytime at home, at social gatherings or business meetings. The coffee is served and received with the right hand. The host serving the coffee fills the small cup only half full. As soon as the guest drinks it, the cup is refilled continually until the guest gently jiggles the cup indicating he has had enough, it is customary to take 2 to 3 cups. Sugar and milk are never added but it is often served with dates.
